## Introduction

At the 1<sup>st</sup> inaugural IEF-EU Energy Day held on 14 February 2017, the European Commission Directorate for Energy delivered a key note speech: "EU energy policies - the international perspective," to strengthen IEF-EU relations and enrich the producer-consumer dialogue in discussion with senior government and industry representatives. The conversation focused on clean energy and energy efficiency trends in Saudi Arabia and the Gulf region.

At the 2<sup>nd</sup> IEF-EU Energy Day, EU representatives will provide an introduction to the EU circular economy strategy, highlighting the benefits of greater energy efficiency and waste management for secure and sustainable functioning of energy markets. The dialogue will take place with government and industry representatives of Saudi Arabia and other IEF countries.

This sharing of knowledge and experiences in an open and neutral platform will help to strengthen cooperation with government and industry stakeholders, and further inform the IEF Energy Dialogue at the 16<sup>th</sup> International Energy Forum Ministerial hosted by India in New Delhi on 10-12 April 2018, other upcoming ministerial, and high-level dialogue meetings.

## Key questions:

- 1. What role does the energy sector play in the circular economy (e.g. CCUS, Emissions and Disclosures to Value, Energy efficiency, Waste to Energy)?
- 2. How are energy producers and energy intensive industries adapting to new policies and performance requirements in the EU and other energy import dependent markets?
- 3. What policy and market measures enable waste to energy and efficiency gains in producing countries?
- 4. How can policy makers and industry including energy producers and consumers work together to stimulate innovation and technology development supporting the circular economy.
