Overview

This is the second annual public round table on the challenge of Cybersecurity in the Global Energy Sector. Since our initial event in October 2014, cybersecurity has dominated headlines, business agendas and geopolitical dialogue.

Organized under the auspices of the International Energy Forum (IEF) and chaired by Secretary General Dr. Aldo Flores-Quiroga, this year's discussion will again explore developing U.S. and international policy trends in the cybersecurity field, along with private sector solutions. We will seek to advance dialogue and policy development by engaging leading experts, government officials, and industry stakeholders.

Cybersecurity presents ever-evolving challenges in the global energy industry:

- National security and terrorism threats to the energy sector, critical infrastructure, energy supply and extractive facilities.
- Cyber-theft for (a) IP, business advantage and trade secrets; and (b) client and contact data.
- Constantly evolving threats from state and non-state actors.

Our round tables and workshops will be organized to address: (1) emerging threats, government policy responses and standards; (2) how companies and governments organize internally in the new age of cybersecurity threats; (3) how cybersecurity impacts the security of infrastructure, ports and pipelines; and (4) the new front line – how sanctions and controls on technology are entering the cybersecurity landscape.
