<p><b>9:45-11:00</b></p>	<p><b><u>Plenary session 1: Oil markets: a new normal or just another cycle, and what does it mean for Asia?</u></b></p> <p><i>Oil price volatility in 2014-2015 reached its highest level since 2008-2009 and its determinants are the subject of much discussion. Developments on both the supply and demand sides, from the unconventional revolution to greater efficiency in consumption, passing through adjustments in credit and financial markets, are drawing the attention of observers as potential drivers of a new reality for the global oil market. Such an evolution of the gas industry has motivated greater interest in its possible impact over the regional energy mix, most notably in the prospects for coal, which to date is the backbone for electricity generation and supports a high share of industrial processes. Coal, it is said, is the real competition for gas, not renewables. While the continuous drop in renewable costs and technological progress makes this option more realistic every year, it is still the case that policy and regulation will play an instrumental role in promoting their deployment.
