Oil Overview: May Update with Data Through March 2022

- Oil demand in JODI reporting countries in March exceeded 2019 levels despite soft Chinese demand.
- Demand was at 101% of pre-COVID levels while crude supply was at 97%.
 - Production is materially lower now vs. 2019 in Nigeria, US, Iraq, Angola, and the UK.
- Diesel, gasoline, and LPG demand in JODI reporting countries were above 2019 seasonal levels, but jet fuel remains depressed at 25% below pre-COVID levels.
- Product inventories in March fell by 32.4 mb (slightly more than the seasonal average) and are now 99.8 mb below the 5-year average.
- Crude inventories in March increased by 12.7 mb (slightly less than the seasonal average) and are now 284 mb below the 5-year average.
- Refinery intake decreased seasonally in March and stood at 98% of pre-COVID levels.

Gas Overview: May Update with Data Through March 2022

- Natural gas demand in JODI reporting countries declined by 3x more than the seasonal average in March and stood near a 5-year seasonal low.
 - Demand was lower in March vs. the 5-year average in the US (-6.3 bcm), Canada (-3.3 bcm), Japan (-2.9 bcm), and UK (-1.1 bcm).
- Gas production in March was slightly above the 5-year average, but ~3% below year-ago levels.
- LNG exports in March were at a seasonal high due to continued robust US exports.
- Gas inventories declined by 8.4 bcm month-on-month in March (less than the seasonal norm of ~13.0 bcm). Inventories are still near a 5-year seasonal low and remain 20.7 bcm below the 5-year average.



Oil Product Demand (44 Countries)






March demand for gasoline, diesel and LPG exceeded pre-COVID levels





Jet fuel demand increased slightly in March but remained 25% below pre-COVID levels






March crude production was at 97% of pre-COVID levels (vs. demand's 101%)

Crude Oil Production (31 Countries)






Crude and product stocks are a combined 383 mb below the 5-year average





Refinery intake stood at 98% of pre-COVID levels








Natural gas production in March was slightly above the 5-year average but 3% below year ago levels






LNG exports were at a seasonal high in March due to robust flows from the US






Gas demand declined by 3x more than the seasonal avg in March with weakness in N. America and Japan






Gas demand for electricity & heat was at a seasonal low in March due to lower demand in the US and Japan
